Visiting from New Zealand, composer, broadcaster, performer and lecturer James Gardner will be in residence in Los Angeles for the week of May 5 through May 12, 2014, to present lecture-recital presentations at UC Riverside, Cal State University Northridge, and Cal State University Fullerton.

Mr. Gardner is the founder of ensemble 175 East, a former student of Brian Ferneyhough, an author with Ashgate books, and a frequent lecturer in Europe, the United States and New Zealand, on topics ranging from music composition to music technology.

Joining him will be pianist and DMA Candidate at the University of Southern California, Dzovig Markarian, to present and perform James Gardner's recent composition *Displacement Activities* which she commissioned with a generous grant from Arts New Zealand. This new piece is for piano solo and live electronics, and will be premiered at USC's Alfred Newman Hall, on Sunday May 11, 2014, at 3 pm.
